With an affordable housing shortage of over 240,000 homes in New Jersey, we are challenged to **BUILD** more HOMES and opportunities for homeownership in northern Ocean County. Advocating for change is one way we can make a real dent in the affordable housing crisis that our community is facing. This year, we helped two families become first-time homeowners. Looking at where we are now, I believe we are well-positioned to be a catalyst for real change in our COMMUNITY.

Our Critical Home Repair Program helped to **RESTORE** 37 affordable homes in our community this past year. Many of the repairs completed have helped low-income senior homeowners who need repairs to remain in their homes and "Age in Place" safely and with dignity.

Next year brings us to our 25th Anniversary. Looking forward, I am cognizant of different ways to fulfill Habitat's mission. As we **EVOLVE** our programs to meet the needs of the community, advocating for change is a priority. Getting as many families into affordable housing as we can is the means by which we do so: pulling together the efforts of our Habitat family – the volunteers, donors, staff, and, of course, our homeowners – to promote dignity and hope.

Homeownership Program

Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity provides families with a unique opportunity to build and buy their own homes. Habitat homeowners are required to show a need for adequate housing, have the ability to pay an affordable mortgage, and partner with Habitat through sweat equity hours. Diana's story explains what the journey can look like for a hardworking Habitat homeowner.

Diana has always dreamed of becoming a homeowner and giving her daughters, Adriana and Ariana, a place they can grow and thrive in. After 6 hard years of living in a small apartment without ADA modifications for her daughters with Spastic Quadriplegic Cerebral Palsy, her dream was finally coming true.

critical home repair program >

Our critical home repair program helps low-to-moderate income homeowners restore and maintain their homes. Our organization's commitment is providing a "hand up," not a "hand out," and we encourage homeowners to "pay it forward" through simple acts of kindness. Millie and Vinny are two homeowners we helped build pride in their homes.

Millie



Millie was so grateful for her repair that she agreed to guest speak at our Bingo event in April to a crowd of 150 people to explain her story and how much Habitat helped her. She is an example of how this program gives homeowners the pride and confidence they need to thrive.

Before moving to New Jersey, Millie originally lived in Queens, New York. She loves how much more spacious New Jersey is compared to a city. In her spare time, she volunteers at Brick and Toms River food pantries.

Millie had concerns about her home, including drafty windows and the inability to lift her legs over her shower tub. Our staff and volunteers were able to replace 9 windows and complete a bathtub to shower conversion in Millie's home, creating a more stable and safer space!







I love that I have my house now. I didn't love it before. I didn't even like to be home. I've never been able to see the sunsets through my windows until this repair. Habitat is not just about building homes. I loved everyone at Habitat and I'm going to miss seeing them everyday.



Having drafty windows and a shower unsuited to a homeowner's abilities can cause unsafe living conditions, as it did for Vinny. He became concerned with weatherization in his home and potentially falling in the shower due to his disability.

Vinny was referred to our critical home repair program by his community clubhouse. In order to keep him safe in his home, our team performed a tub-to-shower conversion and replaced all 11 windows!

St. Joseph's Grade School

Over thirty 7th and 8th graders from St. Joseph's Grade School began building for the first time.

Led by our construction director, the students learned how to build benches that were donated to our 22nd home.

Donovan Catholic High School came out on Giving Tuesday to build garden beds for The Arc of Ocean County. The project was funded by State Farm's Youth Action Grant, teaching students construction skills and informing them about The Arc's and Habitat's work in the community.
